
Term 1 is underway!

Swimming





R 4 & 5 Student learning conferences and goal setting

In Week 6, **Tuesday 6th and Wednesday 7th March** we have student learning conferences for Rooms 4 & 5...a chance for parents, teachers and students to talk about how things are going at school, and where we want to be by mid-year. This is an opportunity for teachers to hear from you about how your child has settled in this year and any difficulties, successes or attitude changes you have noticed at home. Teachers (and students) can also share any observations they have made during the first term at school. Two or three individual academic and social **goals** (or "next steps") will be discussed, and these will be reported back on at mid-year. Children should also accompany their parents and participate in the goal setting and information sharing. (Research shows that when children reflect on their learning and talk about what they would like to do better, helping set goals for improved learning, they are more likely to do something about it.)

Team Tipu will be meeting with parents on different dates...after 6 weeks from starting school and then again after 6 monthly and yearly anniversaries. Any parents are welcome to ask teachers to meet to discuss their child's progress at any time of the year...you don't have to wait until the next scheduled meeting.

School closes at the normal time of 3.00 p.m. on these days, but we ask that parents collect their children promptly after school as teachers will be involved with meetings and not able to supervise children. The meetings run from 3.30 p.m. on both days. Please send in the attached appointment slip as soon as possible. Raewyn will send out confirmed appointment times.

Ouruhia School Pepeha

This term's focus is *Our People/ It's Great to be Me*. As part of this study, we are learning about our school's name, and the history and connection of the people who lived here many years ago. We have adopted this *pepeha*, which is used in introductions to establish identity and heritage.



Ko Maukatere te mauka Ko Pūharakekenui te awa Nō Urihia te whenua Nō Tūāhuriri te takiwā Ko Ōuruhia te kura



We are learning that Maukatere/Mt Grey is our mountain; Pūharakekenui/Styx is our river; the land was first settled by Urihia (sometimes called Uruhia), the son of the chief who founded Kaiapoi pā; we are in Ngai Tūāhuriri's region; and our school is named Ouruhia.

On Wednesday 14th March we are having a school visit to see Maukatere, and we will also be visiting Tuahiwi School. We hope that by the end of this term, many of the children will be able to recite at least the first and last lines of the pepeha, and talk a little about what it means, and some of our connection to Tuahiwi and Kaiapoi.
