Coming up in Term 4...

- Teacher Only Day a reminder that we have a Teacher Only Day booked for the day after Labour Day in Term 4, Tuesday 26th October so if parents want to take a longer long weekend, they can arrange this. These Teacher Only Days are really valued by teachers to be able to keep up to date with new changes in the curriculum, and we thank you for your support. (There will be no school for pupils on Tuesday 26th October.)
- Athletics Sports: because of the need to get our Yr5-8 zone entries in to North Canterbury early in Term 4, we have a slight change to our Athletics sports this year.
 - We are having a selection day on Wednesday 20th October (first week back) for Yr5-8 children hoping to qualify for the **zone sports**. These children have notified us of their intention to try out for the team. This does **not** involve all Yr5-8 children. Raewyn and Mark will run this selection process at school and at the Ouruhia Domain during that Wednesday. (*Pegasus Athletics Tues 2nd November.*)
 - Whole school Athletics... this will be in Week 4, just before Show Weekend.
 Date to be confirmed, but will either be Tuesday or Thursday of that short week.
- **Senior Choir** (Yr5-8) are still working towards the Christchurch Town Hall Music Festival on Friday 5th November. They have an area rehearsal on the first Tuesday after the holidays (Tues 19th Oct). The final decision about the festival taking place will hinge on Covid Alert Levels early in Term 4.
- Kapa Haka festival depending on Alert Levels, this is scheduled for 2nd December.
- Swimming lessons at Kaiapoi Aquatic Centre we have found these lessons to be very beneficial just before the summer holidays (and before our school pool warms up) so we have booked these again this year in Week 7 and 8 of Term 4 (late November, early December)


