
Once again, ERO has acknowledged that we are **doing a great job** here as teachers and parents. Well done to all the staff, Board, and supporters of our fantastic wee school. Some key points from the report are quoted below:

Excerpts from the 2018 ERO report on Ouruhia School:

- The school is effectively achieving equitable and excellent outcomes for most of its students.
- Students are **achieving well** in reading and mathematics. Overall achievement in reading, writing and mathematics for all groups have had **sustained improvement over time**.
- The school has many **effective processes** to progress the learning and achievement of all children. These particularly relate to **children's wellbeing and opportunities** in learning. There is a deliberate **focus on relationships** which is providing a **culture of inclusiveness**.
- Leadership builds relational trust and effective collaboration at every level of the school community. Children, parents, whānau and the community are well known and learning-centred relationships are actively promoted.
- Teachers have effective practices to support children who need extra support with their learning.
 They know these children well as individuals and learners, and carefully monitor and report to parents each child's progress.
- The board actively represents and serves the community and school in its role. It takes pride in the improvements and successes which the school community celebrates
