At the end of this term we will be farewelling some of our staff: some are retiring, some following new paths, some winning promotion. After many years of fairly stable staffing (teachers love it here!), we now need to say a huge thank you and best wishes to these amazing teachers:

- Teri Aylward (14 years at Ouruhia), has taught middle school and senior classes. Teri
 has a real gift for holistic teaching, seeing the whole individual with its interwoven
 threads of emotional, social and academic needs. She has a real passion for
 literature, poetry, character education, pastoral care and support, and kapa haka, to
 name but some. She has been a valued member of the Board of Trustees and also
 held management portfolios for Health, Digital Technology and Liaison Teacher for
 our Kātote Kahui Ako (Kaiapoi cluster of schools).
- Prue Harris (12 Years at Ouruhia), has taught Reading Recovery and supported our special needs children, as well as, at times, leading Literacy initiatives, relief teaching in junior and middle classes, assessing and writing student reports, being NZEI rep and assisting the whole school with playground supervision and sports days. Prue is absolutely passionate and very skilled at teaching skills for early reading.
- Judy West (2 ½ years), has taught in Team Tipu, and come to love (and excel at) this very junior level after teaching in other schools at a range of levels. She has been a wonderful leader of our PB4L (Positive Behaviour) programme, and a great support for other staff in Maths and Literacy, as well as leading our senior choir.
- Colleen Gallagher (23 years), has taught juniors and middle school classes both fulltime and part-time, as the sole teacher, as a job-share, and more recently in a collaborative arrangement with a partner teacher in Team Tipu. Colleen has many strengths, not the least of which is her lovely calm, warm and kind demeanour, and ability to support and get the best from people around her. She tirelessly supports and co-ordinates our special needs programmes as SENCO, and more recently has been able to pursue professional learning in te reo Māori at Te Wānanga o Aotearoa, and completing her Masters degree at Canterbury University last year on study leave.

We are struggling to work out how we can manage our traditional end of year celebration and prize-giving under the current Covid Framework. It is just too hard with restrictions on numbers for gatherings to do what we normally do, so this is the plan for next week:

Tuesday 14th Dec 1:30pm – 3:00pm: PTA water sports afternoon. A big thank you to our wonderful PTA for organising this for our children. Helpers are all vaccinated. Any parents may attend to watch their children, but must wear masks and observe distancing protocols.

Thursday 16th Dec 2:00pm – 3:00pm: Class and individual items, Christmas songs, performances from some of our children. A musical celebration, because music makes us happy! All parents welcome...to be held outdoors at school. There is no requirement to show vaccination passports for school events like this, but we ask you to...

- scan the QR code on entry to the school grounds

- if possible, bring a fold-up chair/camp chair or similar so seating can be spaced. (We will have some school seating available.)
- enjoy the efforts by the children.

For parents who cannot attend at this time, we will be filming or live streaming the event.

Friday 17th Dec 11:00am-12:00 noon: Class awards and special cup presentations – our final assembly. This will also be held outdoors on our last day of school. Again, if parents cannot be there at that time, we will be filming the event or livestreaming it.

Following this prize-giving (around noon), we farewell our school leavers, and wish you all a safe and happy holiday. Please collect your children by 12:30 as the staff and Board will be meeting for lunch at that time and will not be available to supervise children.
